About 1779 or 1780 Enoch Hooper married Letitia Birding of South Carolina in a Fort during the Revolutionary War. After peace was declared, they moved to Caldwell County, Kentucky, where a daughter, Betsy was born. She married Matthias Cook of Kentucky, and they had one son, Enoch Hooper Cook born in Caldwell County, September 17, 1803. Matthias Cook and family moved to Louisiana in 1809. Remaining there only a short time, he then moved to Mississippi where he died about the year 1810. About 1818 his widow, Betsy, with her mother Letitia Birding Hooper, moved to White Hall in Marengo County, Alabama, where the widow Betsy Hooper Cook, wife of Matthias Cook, met William Selman. He was a widower, and he and Betsy Hooper Cook were married.

His daughter, Elizabeth Selman, married Enoch Hooper Cook in 1824, Enoch Hooper Cook being the father of Judge John T. Cook and others.

Enoch Hooper Cook married the second time on April 7, 1834, to Elizabeth Whitfield; he died January 6, 1877, in Marengo County, Alabama.

The Historical Commission of South Carolina, Columbia, South Carolina, has a record of pay issued to Enoch Hooper for services in Militia of South Carolina in 1779 and 1780. (Write A. S. Salley, Jr., Secretary State Commission; for certified copy.)

In 1779 or 1780 ENOCH HOOPER married LETTITIA BIRDING, who was born on October 28, 1760. She died June 28, 1827, at the age of 65 years, 8 months. On December 28, 1786, they had a daughter named:

BETSY HOOPER. In 1800 BETSY HOOPER married MATTHIAS COOK. BETSY HOOPER COOK died June 23, 1842, age 56 years, 5 months, 26 days.

ENOCH HOOPER COOK, SR., had 12 children, four by his first wife, Elizabeth Brannon Selman, and eight by his second wife, Elizabeth F. Whitfield. There were born to these two marriages ten sons; these sons were educated at The Male Academy formerly located at Rehoboth, Alabama. The families of the 12 children of Enoch H. Cook, Sr., along with their lineal descendants, are listed singly (indicated by Roman numerals) on the following pages.

The following sentiments were expressed by the Masonic Lodge of Camden, Alabama, upon the death of Enoch H. Cook, Sr.:

“TRIBUTE OF RESPECT”

**Hall of Dale Lodge No. 25
Camden, Alabama**

January 26, 1877

Brother Enoch H. COOK, Sr., died at his residence near Camden, January 6, 1877, in the 74th year of his age. ‘Like a shock of corn fully ripe he was gathered to the Fathers in the harvest of eternity.’ He was buried with the usual Masonic honors in the Camden Cemetery January 8, 1877.

He was born in Chester County, Kentucky, 17th September, 1803; with his parents he emigrated to the Territory of Louisiana when quite young, afterwards to Jefferson County, Mississippi, where his father died in 1811. He remained with his mother until 1820, when he moved to Marengo County, Alabama, where he continued to reside until 1835. Since that time he has made his home in Wilcox. He was elected Sheriff of Wilcox in 1843, and served out his term of office with credit and profit to himself and great satisfaction to the people of the county----it being at a time when it was believed to be certain ruin to accept the Sheriff’s office; all of his predecessors, with one exception, having failed and involved many of their friends in bankruptcy.

In politics brother Cook took a decided and active part, always a zealous Democrat. In 1842 he was a candidate for the Legislature, and came very near being elected over one of the most popular Whigs in the county, the latter party being then in the ascendant. Up to the day of his death he felt and took a very active interest in the exciting politics of the day.

Brother Cook connected himself with the Methodist Protestant Church in 1845, lived a faithful and consistent life and died triumphant in the Christian faith.

He was initiated and passed in Dale Lodge, No. 25, in the year 1827 and was raised a Master Mason in Marengo Lodge, No. 28, the latter Lodge he presided over for six years. In 1837 he was elected Master of Dale Lodge, over which he presided for twelve years. He served in the Grand Lodge, on the Committee on Work, for ten years. He received from Dale Lodge, when he retired as Master, a beautiful silver pitcher, with suitable inscriptions, as a testimonial of the appreciation of his many Masonic services and private virtues. He probably did more work in the Lodge than any other man---he made one hundred and forty-five Master Masons, among them were three Grand Masters, viz: W. H. NORR, R. H. ERVIN and SYD SMITH.

In every station and position in which he was called to occupy, and every trust confided to him, he was faithful to all obligations and equal to all responsibilities.

An a husband and father, Brother Cook was kind and affectionate; as a friend, confiding and steadfast; as a citizen, generous and public spirited; as a Mason, a pillar of Wisdom, Strength and Beauty; as a presiding Master, prompt and zealous in the discharge of his duties, always ready to communicate light and instruction. The character of our departed Veteran of the Mystic Tie we would recommend as a model by which to erect our own moral and Masonic edifice---and if we but make some approximation towards his standard we may reasonably hope that when we, too, are called from this terrestrial Lodge below, we may be permitted to join him in the celestial Lodge above. Whilst we drop the sympathetic tear over his grave, let us record his memorial as a slight token of our esteem. Therefore-

1. Resolved, That in the death of Past Master Enoch H. Cook, his family, society, the Masonic Fraternity and the Church have sustained a common loss.
2. Resolved, That his life as a man and a Mason was a plumb line set in the midst of his brethren; he regulated his actions by the square, and circumscribed his desires by the compass, and forcibly impressed upon us all the dignity and importance of our profession.
3. Resolved, That in Masonic charity his arm was ever extended to the falling---his hand ever open to the destitute---his sympathy ever awakened to the distressed.
4. Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be transmitted to the family of this Lodge in their sad bereavement.
5. Resolved, That a page of our minutes be inscribed with his name and the date of his death.
6. Resolved, That these resolutions be published in the county papers.

On August 26, 1907, Past Master ENOCH H. COOK, JR., died at his home in Canton Bend, aged about 64 years. Brother Cook bore an honored name in free masonry, and was the son of that intrepid old Mason, Past Master Enoch H. Cook, Sr., whose labors for free masonry will always cause his name to be remembered, and for whom our sister lodge, E. H. Gook Lodge No. 381, at Gastonburg is named. Brother Cook was a zealous Mason and neither heat nor cold hardly ever kept him from coming to the Lodge. He was a good Mason, a faithful and devoted husband and father, brave soldier for the Southland and a respected citizen, who was also esteemed for his excellent traits of character.

Monday morning January 14th, 1924 at 8:30 o'clock, the sweet spirit of Mrs. A. D. Campbell winged its flight to the Great Beyond.

She was fifty-two years of age, was born and reared in Canton Bend and was the daughter of the late Enoch H. Cook and Elizabeth Wicker Cook, who passed away four years ago.

On November 18th, 1896, there was a double wedding in Canton Bend at the Presbyterian Church when Miss Dadie Harwood became Mrs. Lummie Primm and kissed Lena Cook, Mrs. A. D. Campbell.

To this happy union were born two sons and three daughters who, with their father, await the call to Join her in that City not made with hands. Just ten days before her summons came, her brother, Mr. George A. Cook, died in San Antonio. and the death of two so beloved makes it doubly sad for the dear ones left behind. She reared a lovely family and was the light of the home where the afterglow of her gentle and refining influence will ever linger. She departed from this home quietly and without suffering and while no farewell word was spoken, converse through all her life convinces that she has entered into the Joy of her lord.

Modest, retiring, self-sacrificing, ever thoughtful of others, she was one of the most beautiful characters the world could know, and an appreciation of her cannot be written.

She was a devoted wife, a real helpmate, a tender mother, loving sister, a kind friend under all circumstances, a Christian and consistent member of the Presbyterian Church since childhood. She leaves a grief-stricken husband three daughters: Miss Rebecca Campbell; Mrs. Lee Harrison, Portland, Alabama; Mrs. Sherwood Middlebrooks; two sons: Mr. Albert Campbell, Akron, Ohio; A. D. Campbell, Jr.; two sisters Mrs. John Campbell, Mobile; Miss Ellen Cook, San Antonio; two brothers: Mr. Samuel Cook, Birmingham; Mr. Henry Cook, Eufaula; two nieces two nephews and other relatives and friends to mourn her loss. Her pastor, Reverend J. W. Roseborough, Jr., assisted by Reverend J. O. Wilson, pastor of the Methodist Church, conducted the funeral services. Interment in Camden cemetery Tuesday morning. Deepest sympathy is extended to the bereaved family.”

Due to the fact that there were no telephones, and communication was very limited; there was a custom that at the time of death of a loved one a member of the family wrote out a notice of the death and the time that the funeral was to be held. This was attached to a board, along with a piece of black crepe, and colored boys were hired to take this around, knock at the doors of each person and allow them to read the notice.

In later years the above custom was done away with, and funeral notices were printed and distributed throughout the community. A copy of the Funeral Notice of Mrs. A. D. Campbell is indicated below.

“1873 ARCHIBALD DAVID CAMPBELL 1945

Death came to Mr. A. D. Campbell of Camden, Alabama, just before noon Thursday, May 24th, at a Selma hospital. He was aged 72 years. Mr. Campbell had been in failing health for some months and, while his passing was not entirely unexpected, it came as a distinct shock to the community. Christian services were conducted in the home by Reverend E. O. McKay, pastor of the Presbyterian Church, assisted by Reverend W. W. Homer of the Baptist Church and Reverend T. L. Hill of the Methodist Church. Rites of the Order of Free and Accepted Masons, of which Mr. Campbell had been a member, were conducted at the grave. Interment was made in Camden cemetery.

A. D. Campbell was born in Wilcox County, February 19, 1873, the son of John A. Campbell and Rebecca Jones Campbell. He married Miss Lena B. Cook on November 16, 1896. To this union were born two sons and three daughters: A. D., Jr., who was killed accidentally in 1939; J. Albert Campbell of Akron, Ohio; Mrs. Rebecca (C. T.) Springer of Union Springs, Alabama; Mrs. Frances Elizabeth (L. D.) Harrison of Pensacola, Florida; and Mrs. Antoinette (S. C.) Middlebrooks of Mobile, Alabama. The latter four survive, as well as a host of grandchildren and nieces and nephews. Also surviving is Mr. A. B. Campbell, a brother, of Camden, Alabama.

Mr. Campbell's first wife passed away January 14th, 1924, and on February 21, 1928, he married Miss Jessie May Burson who survives and who, with her daughters' was at the bedside at the time of his death.

Mr. Campbell early professed his faith in Jesus Christ as his Savior and united with His Church as a Presbyterian in 1907. He was one of the oldest members of this congregation. His life was marked by good Christian cheerfulness and a capacity for friendship and love and helpfulness which knew no bounds. His friends were numbered by the number who knew him and the example he set as a devoted husband, father, and citizen will long be a challenge and inspiration to others who knew him."

“THE PASSING OF A. D. CAMPBELL, JR.

The passing of A. D. Campbell, Jr., victim of an auto accident, son of A. D. Campbell and Mrs. Lena Cook Campbell (deceased) brought keenest sorrow to many relatives far and near and sincere regret to many friends in Camden, who knew him from childhood.

His death, near Montgomery, occurred Monday night, August 7, 1939, and his body was not discovered in a deep ravine, until about two o'clock Tuesday afternoon. His car was demolished and he was found a short distance from it. Important papers, identification card, bill folder were scattered about and his watch, which had stopped about 11:25 was found. There is no possible way of ever finding out how the accident happened, which gives an added sadness to the terrible tragedy.

He was a splendid boy of fine principles and high ideals. He was twenty-seven years of age with another birthday in the near future. His untimely death is not only an irreparable loss to his family and kindred but to his young friends who gave him a full measure of their admiration and friendship and who will miss his genial companionship. His death is deplored by all who knew him; it leaves an aching void in the heart of his beloved father and other loved members of the family with whom he spent most of his childhood and young boyhood after the passing of his dear mother. He was born in Camden, August 15, 1911, and received his earliest education in Camden Grammar School through the seventh grade. In the 4th grade he was awarded the medal for class leadership in all his

studies and for excellent behavior. He finished school in 1927 in Clayton, Alabama, where he made his home with his sister, Mrs. Tilmon Springer and Mr. Springer, now of Union Springs, who did for him as their own. After graduation he was employed by Springer Lumber Company to 1939, when a new job was given him by White Roofing Company of Montgomery which he liked and was holding at his death, with the esteem of the company.

Reverend E. W. Roark, assisted by Reverend S. T. Trotter, conducted funeral services at the home of his father, Thursday morning at ten o'clock. Their tributes to the dead in remarks and prayers were impressive and deserved. Mrs. Peyton Burford, Mrs. Ernest Bonner, Mrs. Glenn Liddell, Mrs. L. Y. Sadler, Miss Ava Jordan, Mr. Roy Liddell, Mr. Preston Johnson and Mr. J. M. Moore sang sweetly and low "When They Ring Those Golden Bells" and "Till We Meet Again", favorite songs of the son and father.

Many exquisite floral designs including a blanket of half-blown crimson rose buds for the casket, last gifts of devoted relatives and friends, filled every available space and expressed the affection and esteem in which he was held. Nearly all the flowers were roses, the flowers he loved most.

Pall bearers were young friends from Union Springs and Clayton---Frank Anderson, Dick Branscomb, Lamar Blow, Charlie Williams, Exton Tucker, Wiley Springer, Billie Watson, and John P. Coles, Jr. Interment was in Camden Cemetery in the family plot by the side of his mother. A large concourse of relatives, friends, and acquaintances gathered to pay a last farewell to a young man honored and respected who was a kind and affectionate son, a faithful friend, and a devoted brother. He leaves grief stricken his father; one brother, Mr. Albert Campbell, of Akron, Ohio; three sisters, Mrs. Tilmon Springer of Union Springs, Mrs. Lee Harrison of Pensacola, Florida, Mrs. Sherry Middlebrooks of Mobile, and other loved ones to each of whom deepest sympathy is extended with the earnest prayer that the Heavenly Father will abide with them, and help them to bear with fortitude the sadness and shock of his sudden, tragic death."
