

Last Will and Testament of William Duran deceased.

State of Alabama } Know all whom it may concern, that I  
 Autauga County } William Duran of the County and State aforesaid  
 being of sound mind, in the full possession  
 of all my faculties, do make and declare this to be my last will and testa-  
 ment.

First, I desire that all my Just debts shall be paid, out of the proceeds  
 of such of my personal property, as my executor shall deem best to devote  
 to that purpose.

Second, I give and bequeath all my Real estate, and all of my personal  
 property, that remain after the payment of my debts, to my Wife Eliza M.  
 Duran, to have and to hold during her natural life. And it is my  
 will that at the death of my Wife Eliza M. Duran, then, that all my  
 Real Estate and personal property shall be equally divided between my  
 Children, Namely my Sons James W. Duran, Benjamin J. Duran,  
 Thomas D. Duran, Perry A. Duran, and John E. Duran, and my Daugh-  
 ters Mary S. Duran, Martha Ella Duran, and Julia C. Duran. And if  
 any of my said Children shall not be living at the time, and he or she  
 have left Children, then their or her share shall belong to his or her Child-  
 ren. I also desire that in case my Wife Eliza M. Duran shall marry  
 after my decease, then all of my said Estate, except that which she lawfully  
 acquires to said Eliza M. Duran shall be divided among my Children as  
 above specified.

I hereby appoint Thomas D. Duran my Executor.

I also hereby declare for the satisfaction of all concerned that it  
 is my design by this will to secure to my Wife and minor Children a  
 home, inasmuch if my Estate were divided it would be insuffi-  
 cient for that purpose.
